ENSURING JUSTICE AND EQUITY

In its broadest sense, justice is the principle that people receive what they deserve. In this light, it's an indisputable fact that a great injustice occurred to millions of Californians during the Covid pandemic. Undocumented immigrants, who are concentrated in low-wage sectors, were the hardest hit by the pandemic yet were excluded from federal relief and state safety-net programs, *despite paying their taxes*.

When the opportunity presented itself to help mobilize direct cash assistance to these families, I felt honored to serve. Our task was to unite nearly 30 local nonprofits to ensure equitable cash distribution to afflicted immigrant families struggling to pay rent or put food on the table. This unification was no small feat as the needs were vast, the resources were few, and we had little time to act. We also understood that bringing clarity to the complex needs would be vital in the short and long term. We streamlined applications for the cash across all partners, making the form mobile-friendly and in dozens of languages. As we used Salesforce to track all applications and distributions of funds, we systematically captured millions of data points about the fears and hopes of our immigrant neighbors.

The following brief reports highlight our findings and, more importantly, display the power of coalitions united under a common cause. The ongoing success of the CIRF partnership is a powerful reminder that *we* are stronger than any one of *us*.







DELIVERING INNOVATION

VACCINE EQUITY COALITION

Undocumented immigrants are disproportionately under vaccinated. To address this gap, Mobile Pathways organized 20 CIRF immigration nonprofits into a new Vaccine Equity Coalition. Since August, we've sent culturally appropriate vaccine information to 545,347 immigrants resulting in 10,520 vaccinations.



MOBILE INNOVATION

Many CIRF partners continue to work with Mobile Pathways as we empower them with mobile technology. Our collective approach helps immigrant advocates reach people where they are and empowers them with critical information. **Together, we now reach 656K immigrants via 142 immigration advocate partners.**
